Since its formation in 1994, AEISG has given members a unified voice; ensuring communication and collaboration with industry policy makers and stakeholders.

AEISG is a not for profit industry association that represents the views and advocates the needs of its members.

The primary goal of AEISG is to continuously improve the level of safety and security throughout the manufacture, transport, storage, handling and use of commercial explosives and their precursors (e.g., AN, ANEs) throughout Australasia.

This includes developing codes to address gaps between in-field application and legislation, to set a benchmark for a safe and secure industry.

AEISG prepares submissions on policies, legislation, standards and codes relevant to the explosives industry and related organisations.

Benefits of Membership

- ◆ Sharing of safety and security incidents such that all members can learn, discuss best practices and continuously improve.
- ◆ Representation nationally and internationally with explosives industry regulatory bodies on safety, security and legislative matters.
- ◆ Information provided weekly on issues affecting the industry.
- ◆ Opportunity to provide input to develop and promote AEISG codes of practice, many of which are referenced in Australasian Legislation.

- ◆ Liaison with similar explosives associations in other countries including SAFEX, IME and FEEM.



Who can become an AEISG member?

Organisations who participate in the storage, transportation, handling or use of commercial explosives or explosives precursors in Australasia; or other organisations deemed to be suitable associated with the explosives industry by the AEISG Committee are eligible to apply to become an Associate Member. On paying an annual fee, Associate Members have access to all the information and data produced by AEISG however do not have any voting rights.

Full Membership is available by paying an additional annual fee. Full Members have a role, through voting rights, in guiding the direction of AEISG and the projects that should be undertaken in meeting AEISG's overall objectives.
